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ML Kishigo's Statement on California Proposition 65 dated August 27, 2018

Prop 65 requires that a company give a "clear and reasonable warning" to the individuals before "knowingly and intentionally" exposing them to Proposition 65 listed chemicals unless the company can demonstrate that the exposure is so small that it causes "no significant risk" of cancer or "no observable effect" with regard to reproductive toxins. For many listed Prop 65 chemicals, a California agency has determined "Safe Harbor" levels of exposure which does not require a warning. The list of chemicals and other information regarding Prop 65 can be accessed at www.oehha.ca.gov/prop65.

Because ML Kishigo cannot test every piece of every order that we ship to California for every one of the Proposition 65 listed 700+ chemicals, you may continue to have concerns about the compliance with Prop 65. If so, then the safest option is to include a label on each product that may ship to the State of California. The label will read as follows and will ensure full compliance with California Proposition 65 requirements:

All affected products shipped to California will have a transparent sticker on the packaging, or a hang tag on the product with the Prop 65 Warning.
