Subject: New California Prop 65 Warnings – Update to August 1st, 2018 Letter

To Whom It May Concern:

Proposition 65 requires businesses to notify Californians about significant amounts of listed chemicals in the products they purchase. On August 30th new “safe harbor” warning language, including details of chemicals and exposure, will require manufacturers to identify specific known exposure risks. At the same time, businesses are discouraged from providing an unnecessary warning.

Streamlight Inc. has an exhaustive compliance program and has performed extensive 3rd party testing under the guidance of qualified professionals to establish that our lighting products do not expose consumers to chemicals at levels that would require a warning statement going forward.

Products with a date of manufacture before August 30th, 2018 may have the old warning label and can continue to be sold until that inventory is depleted for either a distributor or manufacturer. Some older, lower volume products that do not warrant compliance engineering will be discontinued. We will forward the necessary communication as these inventories wind down.

Update: Please note we have been advised by a battery supplier that replacement lead-acid battery part numbers 44007, 45630, & 45937 do require the new Prop 65 warning on packaging and it must be associated with the product in catalogs as well as on eCommerce websites. We have provided a link to the Prop 65 warning label for reference.
